I am Jae Ryong Kim, the newly appointed superintendent of the Kyungju Cumberland Hospital as of February 1, 2009. I believe you have enjoyed corresponding with Dr. Jong In Kim who served as superintendent of Kyungju hospital for almost 4 years. Usually the term of superintendent is 2 years but he remained in his post second term. I really look forward to a good relationship with Cumberland First Presbytrian Church with which we have maintained relationship for such a long time ever since the Kyungju hospital was founded with the financial help from your church.


On behalf of Kyungju Hospital, I want to thank you very much for the wonderful gift of \$617.50 (₩833,625) which was received on January 29, 2009 through Mission Office in Seoul. You don't know how much we appreciate for this faithful support you have been sending for the work at Kyungju Hospital.

Thanks to your concern and prayers, things in the hospital are going on well. The Preaching Society of Kyungju Hospital conducted an evangelical clinic at Sinkae Church on April 26, 2008 and through this clinic about 54 people were treated and preached. Another evangelical clinic was conducted at Youngchun Doam Church where 34 people were treated and preached.

Kyungju Hospital donated ₩1,200,000 to Handicapped Association and Foreign Laborers Support Agency during the period from January to December, 2008. We also treated about 17 patients who were unable to pay their hospital bill because of their financial difficulty and live in solitude without anyone to help them financially. The total amount of fund we spent for charity cares amounted to ₩2,836,190.

Thank you again for remembering us and our work at Kyungju Hospital.

Presbyterian Church for your wonderful work for the Lord.
