"Updating an 19th Century Sanctuary for a 21st Century People" Caroline M. Kelly, Pastor

As you know, the Session has appointed a committee to take a fresh look at our sanctuary and, together with the help of an architect who specializes in historic and church architecture, determine how it might better accommodate the way we use it today. The last time the sanctuary was modified was in 1952, with the addition of the Education Building and, before that, in 1929 with the addition of the pipe organ.

At the committee's first meeting, we looked to the Directory for Worship, which guides our arrangement of space for worship. It should: evoke reverence; encourage community; be accessible to all; include a place for the reading and proclamation of the Word; include a font for baptism; include a table for the Lord's Supper; and the pulpit, font, and table be arranged to express their relationship to one another and their centrality in Christian worship.

We also reviewed the history of worship space and the ways in which the space has highlighted different aspects of worship over the years: mystery, hospitality, and participation. We also talked about how worship had changed because of the congregation's role moving from audience to participants, the renewal of the sacraments, the use of all our senses, and the understanding that people learn and engage in different ways.

Our desire to take a fresh look at the sanctuary comes primarily from the desire to adapt the space to changing worship theology/practices and to create a more intimate worshiping community. What this *could* mean is that the chancel area (where the pulpit is) would be enlarged and opened up to provide a permanent place for the music ministry, to remove some of the distance between the worship leaders and the congregation and to provide flexibility for concerts, pageants, and handbells.

We invite you to join us in considering these questions: When you come into the sanctuary,

- What do you notice first?
- What symbols are prominent?
- What aspects of worship seem most valuable?
- What, if anything, is distracting?
- What does our community believe about God?

Nothing about what we are considering is designed to radically change our worship, but we are looking beyond today and next year for what will give us flexibility for years to come. We hope you will pray for the committee as they continue this important work.

MAY SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met in the church library at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, **May 12, 2015**, for its stated monthly meeting. The Rev. Caroline M. Kelly served as Moderator. Ann Kellermeyer served as Clerk.

The Session took the following actions:

- Sustained the examinations of confirmands Marisa Aurigemma, Addison Stroup, and Abbey Workmeister
 and received them as active members of First Presbyterian Church pending their public Profession of Faith
 during worship on Sunday, May 17, 2015.
- Sustained the examinations of Ruling Elders-elect Carl Belt, Jr., Kaitlyn Kauffman, Carolyn Mathews, Judy Stern, and Tim Workmeister for the ministry of ruling elder and agreed to ordain Judy Stern and Tim Workmeister and to install them together with ruling elders Carl Belt, Jr., Kaitlyn Kauffman, and Carolyn Mathews, having previously been ordained, to active service during worship on Sunday, May 24, 2015.
- Adopted the New Beginnings Leadership Team's proposal. (http://www.fpc-cumberland.org/about-us/our-visioning-process/)
- Approved the serving of in-home communion, nunc pro tunc, on Sunday, May 3, 2015, by Ruling Elders
 Barbara Leasure and Ann Kellermeyer to Grace Frickey and by Ruling Elders Linda Smith and Robin
 Bissell to Polly Eyler and Lena Maas.
- Approved the year to date financial statements as of April 30, 2015.
- Approved the serving of communion at the first officer training on Sunday, April 12, 2015, nunc pro tunc.
- Approved the recommendation of the Worship and Music Committee to baptize Brennan Carl Irons, son of Jeremy and Meredith Irons born December 27, 2014, during worship on Sunday, June 14, 2015.
- Called a congregational meeting for Sunday, June 7, 2015, immediately following worship for the purpose
 of electing new corporate officers and amending the bylaws to revise the composition of the Personnel
 Committee.
- Approved the recommendation of the Christian Education Committee to allow the youth group to hold their annual Heritage Days Parking Fundraiser on June 17, 2015.
- Approved May 24, 2015 as the date of ordination/installation of new session members.

In addition, the Session heard:

- A report from Congregational Care and Outreach that 46 people had signed up for the "Tables for Six" dinners.
- A reminder from Worship and Music that June 14 is the beginning of 10:00 a.m. Worship.
- A report from Pastor Kelly that the Belhar Confession was approved by 2/3 of the Presbyteries and will be added to the Book of Confession in June when it is affirmed by the General Assembly.
- A report from Pastor Kelly that the Sanctuary Project Committee will see the preliminary concepts from the architect at their meeting on May 28.

Welcome New Members




On Sunday, May 17, 2015 three new members were received into the First Presbyterian Church family during the 11AM worship service.

GUEST PREACHER COMING TO OUR PULPIT

While our pastor Caroline Kelly is away from the pulpit on June 28th and July 5th, the Worship and Music Committee has searched for an ordained pastor willing to lead us in worship each of those Sundays. Reverend Walt Peters, Associate Stated Clerk of the Baltimore Presbytery, has agreed to be our guest preacher for both of those services and will preside over communion on July 5th when we will celebrate communion by intinction. Walt is familiar with our congregation, having participated in Presbytery meetings held here and lives just over the mountains in Hagerstown. He retired from pastoral responsibilities last fall after 14 years at the First Presbyterian Church of Westminster, Maryland. His biography from their website tells us:

Pastor Walt Peters came to First Presbyterian Church in September, 1999. He is a graduate of Baylor University, and holds both Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Columbia Theological Seminary. He and his wife Rebecca have three grown children and two grandchildren. New Communion Chalice & Paten

The Worship and Music Committee recently purchased two new communion patens and chalices, from Wortman Pottery.



These beautiful blue ash glazed traditional stem chalice and paten sets were dedicated during worship on June 7th and were used for the first time during communion that day. Unlike the silver chalice, the pottery chalice is intentionally wide to accommodate the practice of dipping bread into the juice (intinction).

After worship on Sunday, June 7, the New Beginnings Leadership Team made its final report to the congregation, reviewing the 18 month visioning process that led, last month, to the adoption of an implementation plan for their final recommendations. From the email:

After a year and a half of holy conversation, prayer, and study, we have discerned that God is calling us to engage more deeply in the life of our community in service to our neighbors and God. Recognizing that the single biggest issue facing our community is poverty, this recommendation does not try to specify one organization or one opportunity for service on which we should focus. Instead, it outlines a process for evaluating and opportunity for service that comes to the session for consideration. In this way, we think we can connect with a broad variety of opportunities that will allow us to engage more of the congregation in God's work of life-giving and lifechanging ministry with our neighbors.


