## WORSHIP & MUSIC NOTES

Lent is the 40-day season before Easter (not including Sundays). Originally, it was a time of preparing candidates for baptism on Easter. Over the centuries it has evolved into a time devoted to renewing our understanding of what it means to be a follower of Christ. We observe Lent in anticipation of the resurrection, and we celebrate Easter remembering the cost of the cross's life-giving victory. Lent began on March 1<sup>st</sup> with Ash Wednesday and will conclude on April 15<sup>th</sup>, the day before Easter Sunday.

The **Lenten worship banner** hanging in the front of the sanctuary depicts our journey with Jesus to the cross and toward the death that ultimately brings resurrection life. This week's panel, symbolizing the themes of God's protection, faith and salvation, was stitched by Juanita Fix.

Alan Hovhaness (1911-2000) was a prolific American composer, born and raised in Massachusetts. Hovhaness's works, while spanning a broad range of styles, are all linked by an inherent mysticism. Prayer of St. Gregory, original conceived for organ and trumpet, is a wordless prayer in the style of Gregorian chant. Unto Thee, O God is a choral motet on the opening verse of Psalm 75, with the vocal parts moving almost exclusively in stepwise motion.



### Model Seder with Rabbi Perman Sunday, April 2 from 4:30-6:30PM Fellowship Hall

Rabbi Mark Perman of B'er Chayim will lead a model Seder for us and our Lutheran and Episcopal neighbors on April 2 in the Fellowship Hall. A Seder is an annual feast designed to tell the story of the Exodus of the Jewish people from slavery in Egypt on Passover. It includes reading, drinking wine, telling stories, eating special foods and singing.

During the course of the evening you will have four cups of wine (small cups!), parsley dipped in saltwater, a flat, dry crackerlike bread called matzah, bitter herbs dipped into *charoset* (a paste of nuts, apples, pears and wine) and a festive meal that may contain time-honored favorites, like matzah soup and roasted chicken. Each item has its place in a 15-step choreographed combination of tastes, sounds, sensations and smells that have been with the Jewish people for millennia.
