PROCLAMATION OF THE ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM

MATTHEW 21:1-11

ERIC STOVER

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples saying to them,

"Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me."

If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately."

This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet saying,

"Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them;

they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them.

A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road,

and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road.

The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting.

"Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who came in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?"

The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

CHORAL INTROIT

SING AND SHOUT PRAISES THE SANCTUARY CHOIR Sing and shout praises! Give God honor and thankfulness; pray! Alleluia! Alleluia, amen! Hosanna, Lord! Praise the Lord! Give glory to his name!

Bach's Chorale Prelude on Valet will ich dir geben is in the minority of Bach's chorale preludes that were not composed as part of a larger collection. Overflowing with power and joy, the piece features the melody of the hymn All Glory, Laud, And Honor in elongated notes in the organ pedals, with the organist playing a rapid, contrapuntal gigue on the organ keyboards.

We begin Holy Week by combining the Palm processional and Passion narrative to affirm the inseparable relationship between the death and the resurrection of Jesus. In this way we lift up the inherent tension that exists between Jesus' joyful entry into Jerusalem and the somberness of his suffering and death.




