The word "thanksgiving," in its Greek-derived form, "Eucharist," is the most widely used description for the Sacrament of the Meal. Other ways are "Lord's Supper," which emphasizes the sense of fellowship we enjoy as we gather, or "Holy Communion," which emphasizes our intimate spiritual relationship with Christ.

Sung by the choir in its original Latin, John Bell's Sanctus was written for the Iona Community, a Christian ecumenical community in Scotland. to teach us to proclaim your truth and to lead us into the fullness of life.

Then, as now, you call women and men, girls and boys, young and old, to be your disciples and to be leaders in your church and our communities. Help us to be faithful to your calling, to trust your Word, and to go where you send us and be what you need us to be.

Open our eyes to your presence among us,

as we share the bread and drink from the cup by which Christ told us to remember him.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these elements we pray, strengthening us to be bearers of hope to the world.

We give our thanks to you, offer ourselves up to you,
