Both the text and tune of this beloved American hymn are often attributed to the **Brooklyn Baptist** pastor Robert Lowry (writer of Shall We Gather At The River). However, Lowry discovered the text after it was published in the New York Observer in 1868, credited only to "Pauline T." The tune, whether Lowry realized it or not. is an amalgamation of preexisting folk tunes.

This summer we are using the scriptures from the Narrative Lectionary instead of the Revised Common Lectionary, focusing on Biblical books and topics that fall outside the typical readings. We conclude our series on the Psalms today and begin a four week series on Ephesians next Sunday, followed by a third series on Revelation.
