# RESPONDING TO THE WORD

#### \* AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

That same eternal God and Father, who by grace alone chose us in his Son Christ Jesus before the foundation of the world was laid, appointed him to be our head, our brother, our pastor, and the great bishop of our souls. The Scots Confession was written in 1560 by John Knox as the charter document for the Church of Scotland, the mother church for American Presbyterians. Though it contains its share of polemics, its literary style is simple and direct, making it a good choice for instruction in the faith more than four hundred years after it was written. Some of its language has been revised to make it more accessible to 21st century ears.

The Christian life is marked by the offering of one's self to God. In worship, God presents us with the costly selfoffering of Jesus Christ, who has claimed us and set us free. In response to God's love in Christ, we offer our lives, our gifts, our abilities, and our material goods for God's service.

All we can do is nothing worth unless God blesses the deed; vainly we hope for the harvest-tide till God gives life to the seed; yet nearer and nearer draws the time, the time that shall surely be, when the earth shall be filled with the glory of God as the waters cover the sea.
