March 29: 7:00 PM Maundy Thursday Service at Emmanuel Episcopal

Come hear the story of Jesus' last night with his disciples and share a sacred meal in his name. This special service includes the option of foot washing, healing prayer and anointing for service. Clergy and musicians from all three churches will provide leadership.

March 30: 12:00PM Good Friday Service at First Presbyterian in the Chapel

We will remember Jesus' crucifixion in a brief, quiet service including a reading of the Passion story from the Iona Community, Taizé music and prayers. The hours of noon to 3:00 p.m. are particularly significant as these commemorate the time Jesus hung on the cross.

7:00 PM Good Friday Service at St. Paul's Lutheran

Our service will be contemplative and will include a dramatic reading of the Passion Narrative according to John, a time for venerating the cross, and music offered by the choirs of all three churches.

March 31: 10:00AM Egg Hunt and Blessing Milestone

Join us on Saturday, March 31st, at 10:00AM in the Fellowship Hall for our Easter Egg Hunt and Blessing. This is a Milestones Ministry Moment for young children, grandchildren, their families and friends! We will start the morning with a breakfast potluck. We will provide drinks, plates, silverware, and ask that you bring a breakfast food to share. Activities will include devotional, egg coloring, egg hunting, and a blessing of the eggs.

April 1: 7:00 AM Easter Sunrise Service at Rocky Gap

Greet the sunrise with our Easter Sunrise Service at Rocky Gap (Mountain View Pavilion). We celebrate the Resurrection in a service including the reading and proclamation of the Easter story, communion and music led by Zach and Mikayla Dodge and Bryan Lohr. Remember to dress warmly. Hot beverages will be available after the service.

10:00 am Easter Fellowship in the Library

Visit with family and friends and snack on treats in the Library before gathering in the sanctuary for Easter Sunday worship.

11:00 AM Easter Sunday Service

We celebrate the Resurrection with the Proclamation of the Gospel according to Mark and communion. Easter music will include choral anthems in diverse styles by Alice Parker and Robert Shaw, Mark Hayes, and Larry Shackley. The Sanctuary Choir will also be joined by students from the brass department at Frostburg State University.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

WELCOME VISITORS: We are glad you found your way to First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland. For more information about opportunities to worship, learn and serve with us, we encourage you to visit the table outside the church office. CHILDREN IN WORSHIP: While we do provide a nursery for young children, we also welcome you to bring your child with you to worship. We have "worship bags" in the back of the sanctuary that include materials for drawing and coloring, as well as Bible stories and Bible word-find games. After the Time for Young Disciples, children may go to the nursery for a Bible lesson or remain in the sanctuary. Our "Young Children in Worship" pew card contains information about why young children should be encouraged to come to worship and how parents and others can engage them more fully in worship.

THE PRAY-GROUND is a special space in the sanctuary for our youngest children and their families. All families are welcome to come and sit in the right front pews with their children seated on the rug. This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. "Jesus said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

FRIENDSHIP PADS: Please locate and sign the red pad in your pew, tear off the sheet and place it in the collection plate during the offering. This important practice allows us to be mindful of new folks and long-time members as well, and is a good way to learn (or remember) the names of those with whom you are seated.
