Music Notes

Based on Micah 6:6-8, Offertory is one of the best-known choral anthems of music educator and publisher, John Ness Beck. Shortly before his death in 1987, Mr. Beck established a foundation for the education and promotion of young choral composers. Bryan Lohr, Director of Music Ministries, was awarded a John Ness Beck Fellowship in 2015.

The closing voluntary **Now Thank We All Our God** is a movement from a Bach cantata, as famously arranged for the organ by 20th century virtuoso organist Virgil Fox. Known for his showmanship, Fox was the organist at the Riverside Church in New York City, before becoming a full-time performer and recording artist.

Jesus and the New Testament make clear promises about the resurrection from the dead. Why is this important?

DEVOTIONS

comfort? How does it give you hope? (2 Thessalonians 2:16-17). How does the Christian belief in the resurrection give you eternal out what they refuse to see: through Jesus we have "eternal comfort and good hope" out that even Moses believed in life after death. Jesus uses their own biblical theology to point pointing out that their question is irrelevant: heaven is not what you are setting it up to be by the resurrection (v. 27). Knowing this, Jesus goes to the real topic of bodily life after death by answer to get to the real point. However, this text is not really about marriage or a definitive theology of heaven. God "is God not of the dead, but of the living" (v. 38). The confusing part is about marriage in your tricky question (vv. 35-36). Jesus uses the Sadducees' preferred focus on Moses to point This passage is both encouraging and confusing.
