
Just a reminder that daylight savings time begins next Sunday, March 8th. Be sure to turn your clocks forward one hour on Saturday night!



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING



One Great Hour of Sharing makes a difference in the world.

On Easter Sunday, our congregation will be contributing to the One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, one of four special offerings sponsored by the Presbyterian Church USA.

Around the world, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. This Offering seeks to alleviate these conditions by the following programs:

PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (PDA) works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees. It receives 32% of funds raised.

PRESBYTERIAN HUNGER PROGRAM (PHP) takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. It receives 36% of funds raised.

SELF-DEVELOPMENT OF PEOPLE (SDOP) Invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues. It receives 32% of funds raised.

As you can see, the One Great Hour of Sharing makes a difference in the world. Please consider giving generously to this offering on April 12.

OPPORTUNITIES TO SERVE

REASON FOR THE SEASON UPDATE

"Reason for the Season" began 23 years ago by the Mission Committee as a less commercial way to give gifts. It's been God's project all of those years and He's blessed it every time by touching your hearts to respond. This year the final total was \$7,085.

That's a lot of "straw" filling Jesus' manger with acts of love and kindness!

What God DOES with the money, through human hands, is what's important.

At Kinnaird Academy in Lahore, Pakistan, students who otherwise could not afford the tuition will continue receiving a quality education thanks to your donation of \$2,081. It will be exciting to see God's plans for them in the future!

You gave \$366 to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to help victims of Hurricane Dorian in the Bahamas. Evacuees in shelters with emergency needs are being assisted, and plans made for long-term recovery.

The Fuller Center for Housing will use your \$437 to build and repair homes for low-income families in 60 U.S. cities and 16 countries. Church members have helped in New Bern, NC, and we've given members of the Fuller Center lodging in the church as they fund-raise with a cross-country bike ride.

Another relationship we are building is with Pressley Ridge in Cumberland. The \$337 will provide training in parenting and coping skills for at-risk families through the Homebuilder's Program and three other programs that help children.

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) speak for abused or neglected children in courts, school, and in the community. Your \$417 will help train the volunteers who are God's presence, advocating for the needs of a child. Volunteering is another way to help.

The all-volunteer staff at Interfaith Community Food Pantry on Cumberland St. will be busy stocking their shelves with your \$502. They provide much needed emergency food resources and vouchers for perishable food. God is working in the midst of us. He (and they) could use your hands as well as your funds.

Other missions benefiting are: "This Child Here" in Ukraine; orphans at Q Mountain, Lesotho; Mulange Hospital, Malawi; Welfare Assoc. for Children, Nepal; Juna Amagara, Uganda; SD Learning Camp; Special Ministries; Union Rescue Mission; Salvation Army; Family Crisis Resource Center; Western MD Food Bank; and Allegany Health Right. Of the final total, \$2,945 was given to these other missions. God is everywhere!

The Mission Committee truly thanks all who gave to, or prayed for these missions. Please keep all of the people and work involved with these missions in your prayers. They do pray for us, which is humbling.
