The Session took the following actions:

- Approved the year to date financials as of September 30, 2019.
- Approved the request of Worship and Music Committee to have two communion services on Christmas Eve 2019 at 7:45 PM and 11:00 PM.
- Approved the 2020 scheduled communion services.
- Approved hosting a violin recital for Wesley Mason with a free will offering on Sunday, December 8, 2019 at 3:00 p.m. with Bryan Lohr as accompanist.
- Approved a free will offering to be taken during church on October 27<sup>th</sup> to go toward purchasing car seats for Pressley Ridge consumers.

#### In addition the Session heard:



# Opportunities to Serve

## Pressley Ridge Baby Shower

The Donation Drive to benefit the newborns and toddlers of the Homebuilder's Program of Pressley Ridge culminated in a Baby Shower on Friday, October 25<sup>th</sup>. We looked with great anticipation to this event, one year after initially partnering with Pressley Ridge, by showing the Girl Rising film in the fall of 2018!

The event began with the tradition of a game. We played "Who am I?" Each person had taped to their back the name of a child actor or fictitious character. The goal was to figure out whose name was on your own back by asking questions with a 'yes' or 'no' answer. We guessed them all – Shirley Temple, Macaulay Culkin, Michael Jackson, Tempest Bledsoe, Pinocchio, SpongeBob SquarePants, Charlotte the spider from Charlotte's Web; and Mickey Mouse.

Georgene Mckenzie, Linda Smith, Julie Courtney and Cheri Duncan shared First Presbyterian's global and local mission with Pressley Ridge.

Mary Beth, Wendy, Amy, and Vanessa then told how Pressley Ridge began in 1832 in Pittsburgh as two separate orphanages, one on "Pressley St." and the other on "Ridge St.," the two merging to become the current organization. Pressley Ridge operates in six states: MD, PA, VA, WV, OH, DE, as well as in Portugal and Hungary. In Maryland, the organization is active in Washington, Allegany, and Garrett Counties. There are four programs in Maryland:

- Therapeutic Foster Care: Loving, safe homes that currently house 15 children.
- Outpatient Mental Health: Individual and family therapy and psychiatry for children and adolescents.
- Juvenile Diversion Program: A prevention program to keep kids out of juvenile services.
- Homebuilder's Program: A family preservation program for babies born addicted to substances, keeping newborns with their families, and transitioning them home safely. The Homebuilder's Program teaches parenting and coping skills and relapse prevention and advocates against stigma. They teach about how to become a family and how to maintain family support. All of this is done in 40 hours of therapy in one month's time Homebuilder's serves two families at a time. It is an evidence-based program with 96% of children remaining with their families after 6 months. The program is supported by county, state, and federal grants.

First Presbyterian presented the gifts to Pressley Ridge staff. An envelope was also given with a copy of St. Paul's Lutheran Church's check for \$500 to be used for the purchase of strollers. The afternoon ended with cake, fruit salad and drinks and a photo to memorialize the event. It was expressed to Pressley Ridge staff that others from the congregation had wanted to attend, but were unable.

Thank you and deep appreciation goes to Judy Stern, Kristina Hall, and Jan Layman who planned and organized this mission project; to Brittany Jackson for her help with the coordination; to Zach Dodge for the set-up; to Georgene, Linda, and Julie who participated in the Baby Shower set-up, clean-up and conversation; to the Mission Committee and Session for their support; and to the entire congregation for their generous contribution of gifts and monies. The families with whom Pressley Ridge works will be blessed because of all of you!!
