OLD TESTAMENT READING

GENESIS 1: 1-5, 14-19

1 In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ² the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God weep over the face of the waters. ³ Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. Music Notes

This morning's prelude is a serene and mystical setting of a hymn for the season of Epiphany, from China. The tune and the text of **Midnight Stars Make Bright The Skies** both date from the 1930's.

Though now primarily associated with the Civil Rights movement of the mid-20th century, the spiritual **We Shall Overcome** most likely dates from the days of the slave trade. Similarities with other tunes may suggest that the song, or at least the tune, was used as a worksong aboard slave ships.

The postlude is one of the best known organ works of the late French romantic composer Théodore Dubois (1837-1924.) Starting softly and building to full organ, the work is a sonic depiction of its title **Fiat Lux**, meaning: Let there be light!
