



Worship & Music Notes

Special thanks to Carolyn Mathews, ruling elder here at FPC, for being our lay speaker this morning.

Lent is the 40-day season before Easter (not including Sundays). Originally, it was a time of preparing candidates for baptism on Easter. Over the centuries it has evolved into a time devoted to renewing our understanding of what it means to be a follower of Christ. We observe Lent in anticipation of the resurrection, and we celebrate Easter remembering the cost of the cross's life-giving victory. Lent began on February 17th with Ash Wednesday and concludes with Easter Sunday, April 4th.

The **Lenten worship banner** hanging in the front of the sanctuary depicts our journey with Jesus to the cross and toward the death that ultimately brings resurrection life.

Worship & Music Notes Continued

A native of West Chester, Pennsylvania, Samuel Barber (1910-1981) was one of the most celebrated American composers of the 20th century. Based on an early American hymn, Variations on *Wondrous Love* was his only work for the organ, written in 1958 for Richard Rocklein, organist at Christ Episcopal Church in Gross Pointe, Michigan. Barber opens the piece with the hymn tune played in its shape-note form, sounding ominous with minor and open harmonies.

Today's postlude is often referred to as the "wedge" fugue, because the notes of its intricate subject, or theme, form the shape of a wedge on the printed page. It is one of Bach's final compositions for the organ.
