

PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11

SECOND READING MARK 11:1-11 REV. WALT PETERS

11 When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples ² and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. ³ If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" ⁴ They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, ⁵ some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" ⁶ They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. ⁷ Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. ⁸ Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. ⁹ Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

"Hosanna!


Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.



Worship & Music Notes

Today we welcome back our guest preacher, the Rev. Walt Peters, to the pulpit. He served congregations in Macon, GA; Tampa, FL, and Augusta, GA, before coming to First Presbyterian in Westminster in 1999, being honorably retired by Baltimore Presbytery in October of 2013. In retirement he is an active participant in the Wild West Ministry Group. He and his wife Rebecca reside in Hagerstown. They have three grown children and two grandchildren.

The prelude on this Palm Sunday is the first of three monumental *Chorales* for organ by César Franck (1822-1889.) Often regarded as equals to the organ works of J. S. Bach, Franck's *Chorales* were his last compositions before his death. The *Chorale in E Major* begins with an extended introduction, before presenting the *chorale*, or main theme of the piece. Franck then develops this melody through variations and passages both serene and turbulent, building to a triumphal, heroic conclusion.

Next Sunday, April 4th, Rev. Dr. Walt Peters will serve as our guest preacher for both our 7:00 AM Sunrise Service at Rocky Gap State Park and our 11:00 AM Easter Service in the Sanctuary. Carolyn Mathews will serve as liturgist for our Sunrise Service and Bob Courtney will serve as liturgist for our 11:00 AM service.
