

FIRST READING I JOHN 4:7-21

⁷ Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God.

⁹ God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him.
¹⁰ In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins.


Lift up your hearts!



Today we welcome back our guest preacher, the Rev. Walt Peters, to the pulpit. He served congregations in Macon, GA; Tampa, FL, and Augusta, GA, before coming to First Presbyterian in Westminster in 1999, being honorably retired by Baltimore Presbytery in October of 2013. In retirement he is an active participant in the Wild Wild West Ministry Group. He and his wife Rebecca reside in Hagerstown. They have three grown children and two grandchildren.

Today's postlude is the best-known composition of American organist and composer John Weaver (1937-2021.) Weaver served for 35 years as Organist and Director of Music at Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City, in addition to chairing the organ departments at both the Curtis Institute of Music and The Juilliard School.
