September Session Highlights

The Session of First Presbyterian Church met virtually at 7:00 PM on Thursday, October 15, 2020 for its stated monthly meeting. The Rev. James Young served as Moderator. Jeff Getty served as Clerk.

The Session took the following actions:

- *Approved the Membership Records as of October 14, 2020.
- *Approved the request from the Worship and Music Committee to organize and promote a Christmas fundraiser with the proceeds to be used to purchase a new projector for the sanctuary together with any funds raised from the showing of the St. Olaf Choir performance which will be a prerecorded concert as a secondary source.

In addition the Session heard:

*From the Mission Committee that they will collecting hygiene items until November 15, 2020 for distribution to the Union Rescue Mission. *From the Faith Formation Committee that they are looking for Advent activities that can be done at home since the COVID pandemic limits our traditional Advent activities – this includes a mid-week video featuring readings, mediations and an activity – all virtual.

*From the Worship & Music Committee that during worship on November 1, 2020 we will celebrate All Saints' Day by remembering those members of the congregation who passed away over the last year.

*From the Buildings and Grounds Committee that they will hold the Fall cleanup day on November 7th from 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM.


Just a reminder that this Sunday, November 1st, marks the end of Daylight Savings Time. Please remember to set your clocks back one hour!





Reason for the Season News

"Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" (John 1:46)

Is there a light at the end of the 2020 tunnel? Can anything good come out of 2020?

As Judy Stern said in her Stewardship moment, "Mission...answers God's call to love and serve one another...Difficult times are an opportunity for new growth."

Our church has been providing the means for "hope and a bright future" for lives locally and around the globe for over 20 years through "Reason for the Season". It's an alternative giving opportunity that can be a donation, or a gift to a friend or family member in lieu of a material gift.

Each highlighted mission has a close connection to our church. This year the projects are:

- *Presbyterian Education Board of Pakistan continuing scholarships for "our" seven students (and possibly more?), to give them and ultimately Pakistan a better future.
- *"This Child Here" in Ukraine training of more foster families for children in need of a healthy family that can give them a strong foundation for their life in the years ahead.
- *Q Mountain Connection Emergency Food Fund, Lesotho good for the immediate needs of the people of Qholaqhoe, including "our" five sponsored students, so they *have* a future.
- * Western Maryland Food Bank a refrigerated truck in order to provide fresh food for people of Cumberland and the surrounding area, for a more healthy life.
- *Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) support for children who need someone on their side to guide them through the local court system, which


will impact their adult life.

There will be more about each project, and possibly another one, in the December newsletter. Any of the other missions our church supports may be donated to also, such as Special Ministries, Union Rescue Mission, Juna Amagara in Uganda, etc.

There will also be an insert in the December bulletins for you to mark which mission(s) you'd like to help, or just jot them down on a piece of paper. Inserts and checks or money can be put in the offering plate, in church office, or given through Realm.

Please prayerfully consider giving this year to something that you feel a strong connection to. It's not too late for something good to come out of 2020...hope and a bright future for us all. Look what came out of Nazareth!
