

Music Notes

PEACE THANKS PRAISE

Three watchwords for this season of gratitude and thanksgiving. The Music for this morning's worship service spans three centuries and reflects this joyful theme.

"Thanks Be To Thee" is a seasonal tradition, with words of thanks being set in the 20th century to this 17th century aria. It is also known as "Largo" or "Ombra mai fu," the opening aria for Handel's opera "Xerxes," composed in 1738. Timothy Shaw is a 21st Century American composer from New Hampshire and has enjoyed a multi-faceted career as composer, professor, church musician and author. His "Psalm of Thanksgiving" is a joyful setting in two parts with a recurring melody and flute obligato.

"Oh Lovely Peace" is an idyllic duet of another time employing anthropomorphic fantasy-like traits of "wavy corn" "valleys smile." It is pure joy which Handel composed as part of his "Judas Maccabeus" oratorio. The sonorous thirds in the duet are even more convincing of peace and tranquility as we journey back to the 18th century.
