

1 KINGS 19:1-4 (5-7) 8-15A

19 Ahab told Jez'ebel all that Eli'jah had done, and how he had slain all the prophets with the sword. ²Then Jez'ebel sent a messenger to Eli'jah, saving, "So may the gods do to me and more also, if I do not make your life as the life of one of them by this time tomorrow." ³ Then he was afraid, and he arose and went for his life, and came to Beer-sheba, which belongs to Judah, and left his servant there.⁴ But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a broom tree; and he asked that he might die, saying, "It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life; for I am no better than my fathers."

²⁶ Then they arrived at the country of the Ger'asenes,^[a] which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷ And as he stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons; for a long time he had worn no clothes, and he lived not in a house but among the tombs. ²⁸ When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him, and said with a loud voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beseech you, do not torment me." ²⁹ For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him; he was kept under guard, and bound with chains and fetters, but he broke the bonds and was driven by the demon into the desert.) ³⁰ Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. ³¹ And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. ³² Now a large herd of swine was feeding there on the hillside; and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them leave. ³³ Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned.

³⁴When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they fled, and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind; and they were afraid. ³⁶And those who had seen it told them how he who had been possessed with demons was healed. ³⁷Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Ger'asenes^[b] asked him to depart from them; for they were seized with great fear; so he got into the boat and returned. ³⁸The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but he sent him away, saying, ³⁹ "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP: We welcome you to bring your child with you to worship. We have "worship bags" in the back of the sanctuary that include materials for drawing and coloring, as well as Bible stories and Bible word-find games. Our "Young Children in Worship" pew card contains information about why young children should be encouraged to come to worship and how parents and others can engage them more fully in worship. Nursery care is provided during worship for all children 4 years of age and younger!

THE PRAY-GROUND is a special space in the sanctuary for our youngest children and their families. All families are welcome to come and sit in the right front pews with their children seated on the rug. This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. "Jesus said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

This important practice allows us to be mindful of new folks and long-time members as well, and is a good way to learn (or remember) the names of those with whom you are seated. PIPE ORGAN NEWS: Our Pipe Organ is down, however the problem is not related to the Organ Console Project under contract with Lewis & Hitchcock. The 5 HP electric motor which powers our rotary wind bellows failed on Saturday June 4th while Nancy Hodges was practicing. Under supervision of Bob Courtney and Belt Construction Personnel, the 450 lb. motor was removed and delivered to IM Motors of Fort Ashby, WV for repairs. This motor was last repaired in 1985 and we hope this repair will last another 40 years.

Progress continues on our Organ Console Rebuild Project as Judie Brown, our Director of Music/Organist, spent much of May fine tuning the specifications and controls desired to make our new organ console very functional and user friendly. All of these specifications were sent to Syndyne Corporation of California who will build our sound-state relay and control system and engrave our draw knobs and control plates.

The organ console cabinet is being modified for the new controls and will be re-finished in July, by Ballen Furniture Services of Beltsville, MD. It is anticipated all components will be installed in the console cabinet in August, with installation of the new console taking place in September.

Our Organ Campaign ended on May 31st and we are excited to report that \$93,100 was raised. All funds remaining after completing the organ console rebuild and organ repairs will be added to the Organ Endowment Fund to be used for yearly maintenance and tuning of the organ. We are most grateful for the overwhelming support from our congregation and friends of First Church who supported this campaign. We are especially thankful to Kathy Getty for her leadership of this campaign.
