

SECOND READING

LUKE 10:1-11, 16-20

10 After this the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come. ² And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³ Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. ⁴ Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' ⁶ And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you. ⁷ And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages; do not go from house to house. ⁸ Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you; ⁹ heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' ¹⁰ But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, ¹¹ 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off against you; nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.'

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

WELCOME: A very warm welcome to everyone who comes to worship with us here at First Presbyterian Church! We are proud of being a "Big Tent Church" where everyone is welcome to join us in worshiping and serving our Lord, Jesus Christ. We welcome and encourage worshipers of all races, all women, men, and members of the LGBTQ+ community, all political parties, and all walks of life. We welcome you to worship with us.

WELCOME VISITORS: We are glad you found your way to First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland. CHILDREN IN WORSHIP: We welcome you to bring your child with you to worship. We have "worship bags" in the back of the sanctuary that include materials for drawing and coloring, as well as Bible stories and Bible word-find games. Our "Young Children in Worship" pew card contains information about why young children should be encouraged to come to worship and how parents and others can engage them more fully in worship. Nursery care is provided during worship for all children 4 years of age and younger!

THE PRAY-GROUND is a special space in the sanctuary for our youngest children and their families. All families are welcome to come and sit in the right front pews with their children seated on the rug. This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. "Jesus said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

FRIENDSHIP PADS: Please locate and sign the red pad in your pew, tear off the sheet and place it in the collection plate during the offering. This important practice allows us to be mindful of new folks and long-time members as well, and is a good way to learn (or remember) the names of those with whom you are seated. If you are visitor, please fill out the "Welcome to First Presbyterian Church" card in the pew rack and put it in the offering plate when it comes by during the service.

PERSONAL LISTENING DEVICES: (amplifiers) are available in the back of the church for use during worship. Please see an usher for assistance.

PIPE ORGAN NEWS: Our Pipe Organ is down, however the problem is not related to the Organ Console Project under contract with Lewis & Hitchcock. The 5 HP electric motor which powers our rotary wind bellows failed on Saturday June 4th while Nancy Hodges was practicing. Under supervision of Bob Courtney and Belt Construction Personnel, the 450 lb. motor was removed and delivered to IM Motors of Fort Ashby, WV for repairs. This motor was last repaired in 1985 and we hope this repair will last another 40 years.

Progress continues on our Organ Console Rebuild Project as Judie Brown, our Director of Music/Organist, spent much of May fine tuning the specifications and controls desired to make our new organ console very functional and user friendly. All of these specifications were sent to Syndyne Corporation of California who will build our sound-state relay and control system and engrave our draw knobs and control plates.

The organ console cabinet is being modified for the new controls and will be re-finished in July, by Ballen Furniture Services of Beltsville, MD. It is anticipated all components will be installed in the console cabinet in August, with installation of the new console taking place in September.

Our Organ Campaign ended on May 31st and we are excited to report that \$93,100 was raised. All funds remaining after completing the organ console rebuild and organ repairs will be added to the Organ Endowment Fund to be used for yearly maintenance and tuning of the organ. We are most grateful for the overwhelming support from our congregation and friends of First Church who supported this campaign. We are especially thankful to Kathy Getty for her leadership of this campaign.
