- ❖ At QHOLAQHOE in LESOTHO, Thabang Coza is a very humble boy and a double orphan, taken care of by his uncle and aunt. Lynn Minderman says he has a good chance to attend college next year, if he has a scholarship through Qholaghoe Mountain Connections. https://qmconnect.org
- ❖ In CUMBERLAND, it's a wish for help in escaping an abusive relationship, or to be safe in a loving family. Family Crisis Resource Center offers emergency shelter, food, clothing, and counseling.
- Also in CUMBERLAND, unfortunately, families with empty cupboards wish for a basic necessity, food. The Western MD Food Bank can be a resource, but only if they have enough food on the shelves.
- ❖ A committee in **CUMBERLAND** is working to start a **COMMUNITY CAFÉ** where everyone can eat with dignity in a restaurant environment, paying what they can afford. Top on their list is start-up funds.
- Other: You may also donate to Mulanji Hospital, Malawi; Dakota Learning Camp, SD; Nepali orphanage; Interfaith Food Pantry; etc. Please indicate your preference below.
