MUSIC NOTES

We welcome Katie Hendrix as a guest member to our choir this morning. She joins the choir for our anthem and is also a member of the Offertory Trio singing a beautiful acappella setting of "Pie Jesu" from a new 21st century composition, "Requiem Novum" by Swedish composer Marten Jansson.

Requiem Novum weaves drama, emotion, and exquisite compositional technique into a masterpiece for our time. In the entire work, the choir (singing the traditional Latin texts) represents the mourning and God-fearing congregation, while a soloist (singing new English texts by Charles Anthony Silvestri) answers as one beyond the veil, sending back words of comfort and hope. Highly melodic and incredibly moving, Jansson's new setting of the Latin Requiem offers a new perspective on grief and loss. "Pie Jesu" combines the dual messages into one of peace and rest.

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP: We welcome you to bring your child with you to worship. We have "worship bags" in the back of the sanctuary that include materials for drawing and coloring, as well as Bible stories and Bible word-find games. Our "To Families with Young Children" pew card contains information about why young children should be encouraged to come to worship and how parents and others can engage them more fully in worship. Nursery care is provided during worship for all children 4 years of age and younger!

THE PRAY-GROUND is a special space in the sanctuary for our youngest children and their families. All families are welcome to come and sit in the right front pews with their children seated on the rug. This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. "Jesus said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).
