We welcome and encourage worshipers of all races, all women, men, and members of the LGBTQ+ community, all political parties, and all walks of life to join us. We welcome you to worship with us.

WELCOME VISITORS: We are glad you found your way to First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland. SHARING OF JOYS & CONCERNS: Please use the orange prayer request cards in the back of the sanctuary by the bulletins to share any joys and concerns. Place the card in the offering plate once you have completed your request. The ushers will bring them to the pastor during the offering. The orange prayer request cards are also available in the pew racks.





CHILDREN IN WORSHIP: You are welcome to bring your child with you to worship. We have "worship bags" in the back of the sanctuary that include materials for drawing and coloring, as well as Bible stories and Bible word-find games. Our "To Families with Young Children" pew card contains information about why young children should be encouraged to come to worship and how parents and others can engage them more fully in worship. Nursery care is provided during worship for all children 4 years of age and younger!

THE PRAY-GROUND is a special space in the sanctuary for our youngest children and their families. All families are welcome to come and sit in the right front pews with their children seated on the rug. This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. "Jesus said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

REASON FOR THE SEASON

Light! One of the key necessities for good growth in plants.

That seems to be the theme for this year's Reason for the Season. . .light and growth.

What better theme to use for our Christmas extra-mile giving, celebrating the birth of the Light of the World!

Our Reason for the Season is a way of giving gifts to missions that our church has a close connection with, supporting locally and around the world. It can also be an alternative-giving opportunity in lieu of a material gift. Each one will be described more in the December newsletter, so you can decide which speak the most to your heart.

This year's projects are growing, thanks to light in many forms:

*PRESBYTERIAN EDUCATION BOARD OF PAKISTAN (PEB) will celebrate 25 years of educating Pakistani children, both Christian and Muslim, in schools rebuilt after the government returned them. We are continuing scholarships for "our" seven students (and possibly more?) to give them, and ultimately Pakistan, a brighter future.

*LIVING HOPE FOR CHILDREN IN UGANDA (FORMERLY JUNA AMAGARA) supplies children, many of whom are AIDS orphans, with the basic necessities of food, shelter, health, and love. We are continuing scholarships to high school and college students who will shine Christ's light to others. Several who entered school with scholarships when Rev. Ben started Juna Amagara have now graduated.

*GRAND 'ANSE IN HAITI is providing much needed medical care and other basics where there is little. The total number of clinics is 20+ and patients treated as of 2022 was 3,435. Referrals have been made for end-stage breast cancer, pediatric orthopedic conditions, infected wounds, and other health problems. GAHDA is helping to grow the limited resources, including equipment.

*INTERFAITH FOOD PANTRY IN CUMBERLAND stocks its shelves to feed local people who are experiencing an emergency need for food. It serves everyone from low-income families, single parents, senior citizens, unemployed individuals, disabled veterans, working poor, etc. A referral from a church or social service organization is needed. Volunteers are always welcome.

*PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE IN MAUI, HAWAII is helping in the restoration after the deadly fires this past summer. Funds are needed for urgent immediate care but also for the development of long-term projects and assistance, to bring healing from both the physical and emotional long-lasting effects. Years of recovery lie ahead.

*POSSIBILITY SHOP in Cumberland gives a hand-up of simple essentials. It provides 13 organizations with space to offer 21 programs, among them the Allegany County Health Dept., Horizon Goodwill, HRDC, MD Coalition of Families, MD Wellness, and W. MD Food Bank. Services range from clothing, hygiene supplies, outdoor gear, phones, food, help getting a driver's license, etc.

*SOLIGHT IS A SOLAR LIGHTS COMPANY with a project to supply light when the power goes off due to war or other extreme emergencies. Donations can be designated to several areas. Ours will go to Ukraine. The small solar lanterns are collapsible, easily carried, and not reliant on the power grid. Children especially are calmed by the light, traumatized from sheltering in darkness.

Any of the other missions our church supports may be donated to also, such as Special Ministries, Union Rescue Mission, "This Child Here", Shanti Nepal, etc.

Please prayerfully consider giving this year to what you feel a strong connection to.
