Nursery care is provided during worship for all children 4 years of age and younger!

This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. This Lent you have several options for group and individual faith formation.

- Join Pastor Alison on **Thursday evenings** for our **study on the book** "A **Time to Grow**" which encourages readers to slow down, move through the painstaking process of growth, and end together with great feasting and celebration of the resurrection. **Classes will begin February 15th and last for six weeks.** A soup dinner will begin every meeting at 5:00 PM with the class starting at 5:30 PM.
- Our daily devotional "Holy Solitude" introduces readers to figures in both Scripture and Christian history whose stories of discernment and discipline are a guide for our own spiritual practices as we seek to know God more fully and follow Christ more faithfully.

As the book prompts, particularly think about how to prepare a prayer space for Lent and ponder what a practice of fasting and almsgiving might look like for you. We will start our discussion on Sunday Feb 18th with these questions and then move to prepare for the First Full Week of Lent.
