A MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION-CORPORATION of First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland, Maryland is called by the Session for Sunday, November 16, 2025 following worship.

The purposes of the meeting are to amend the bylaws in section five. The proposed change and explanation are listed below.

Section 5 Meetings A. There shall be an annual meeting of the church held during the month of January-February for the transaction of any business properly coming before such meeting. The hour and place shall be designated by the Session. The date of the annual meeting may be temporarily changed by the Session when necessary, provided that the required public notice is given.

Explanation: This amendment changes the date of the annual meeting of the church from January to February. Moving the meeting to February will allow sufficient time for all committees to thoroughly complete their reports and allows for adequate time for the completion and printing of the church annual report.

Rationale: This will give the congregation a more accurate report of the workings of the church since committees will receive the information needed to complete their year-end reports.

**CHILDREN IN WORSHIP:** You are welcome to bring your child with you to worship. We have "worship bags" in the back of the sanctuary that include materials for drawing and coloring, as well as Bible stories and Bible word-find games. Our "To Families with Young Children" pew card contains information about why young children should be encouraged to come to worship and how parents and others can

engage them more fully in worship. Childcare is provided during worship as needed! Please see an usher if you have any questions.

THE PRAY-GROUND is a special space in the sanctuary for our youngest children and their families. All families are welcome to come and sit in the right front pews with their children seated on the rug. This front row seat will allow God's youngest children to participate in the service in a place where they can see and hear best. There will be activities provided so that their little hands are kept busy while participating in worship. "Jesus said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

SECOND SUNDAY SOCIAL-THANKSGIVING GATHERING: The Congregational Care Committee will once again be hosting Second Sunday





Join us as we look at what the Bible says about prayer, learn practices from the church's history, and discover how prayer can help us ponder God's promises this Advent season.

Join us for Adult Sunday School at 9:45 AM in the Dakota Room. We will be using N.T. Wright's, *Revelation* to get a "remarkably clear glimpse into God's ultimate design for the entire creation. We will be looking into how Jesus the Messiah's triumph and the resulting costly victory of his followers overcome the powerful evil forces at work, particularly with idolatrous and oppressive political systems."


