THE CHRISMONS, or “symbols of Christ” decorating our tree were originally created by members of our congregation in the early 1980s. They were updated during Caroline Kelly’s pastorate. Chrismons are traditionally white and gold. White for the liturgical color of Christmas and to represent Jesus’ purity and gold to symbolize His majesty and glory. **The Chrismon Tree** was first developed in 1957 by Frances Kipps Spencer, a member of the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia. Even though Christian symbols have been used for centuries to share the ministry of Jesus Christ and/or the history of the Christian church, Ms. Spencer developed these symbols into a form that would be appropriate for a church tree. Additionally, she created the word “Chrismon” by combining the words “Christ” and “monogram.” Symbols include various star shapes (5 points for the 5 wounds of Christ, 8 points for star of Bethlehem), the triangle (Trinity), the Cross (in various forms), the dove (Holy Spirit), the lamb (Jesus), and the fish (Christ’s followers).

In addition to the Chrismons we have unique ball ornaments adorning our tree.

In 2011, our church joined the Czech Partnership Network between churches in the ECCB (Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren) and the PC(USA). Our partner church is in Vsetín, near the border with Slovakia. Our two towns have much in common.

Dan Žarsky, the head of Vsetín's Diakonia that works with the elderly, handicapped, etc., visited us early in the Partnership. He brought a set of 12 very thin, brown glass Christmas balls as a gift to our church. The Czech Republic is known for its glasswork. These are very fragile. See if you can find the 8 surviving ones near the top half of our sanctuary tree. For more information about the Partnership, go to <http://czechpres.net>.
